Garage Door Replacements: Senke Overhead Garage Door Company has completed all scheduled replacements in March with the exception of two, which should be done shortly.

Roofing: 174-175, 177, 280-281, 290-295, 223-225, 233-234, 39, 127, 128. Note—this list does not include identified roof leak issues reported over the winter season.

South Side Sign Replacement

Last year, we replaced the 40 year old sign at the north entrance. The posts will be painted this summer and the bed will be finished off with stone. The south sign is being replaced this summer along with the front side on the right as you drive in. These are also 40 years old and in dire need of replacement.

Town of Manlius Notice of Change for Brush Drop Off

Starting Monday, April 14, 2025, until further notice: Brush drop off at the Town of Manlius Highway Department will be limited to Town of Manlius Residents ONLY, on Mondays from 7am-2:30pm. No dump trailers, contractors or landscapers will be allowed into the facility. The gates will be locked Tuesday through Sunday due to the construction of the highway expansion.

Brush, garden waste as well as hazardous materials are not to be placed in the gray trash bins or blue recycle bins.

Residents can sign up for the Town of Manlius Brush District for yard waste pickup by calling 315-637-8815 or contacting Sharon Lake, Trash & Brush Coordinator via email at slake@townofmanlius.org. The cost for this service is around \$65 per calendar year and would be included in your taxes. Brush pickup is bi-weekly and is performed by Syracuse Haulers. You can also bring your yard waste over to the Town of Manlius Highway Department. Check with them for hours at 315-656-3090.

Avoid Common Scams

Scammers are getting more craftier and we all have to be more aware.

Beware of phishing and Smishing messages—Scammers often disguise themselves as trusted entities like the IRS. Check the email address of the sender and never open links or attachments from untrusted sources.

Watch out for fake tax refund claims—Fraudsters may send notifications of a fake "tax refund" to lure you into sharing sensitive information. The IRS will never initiate contact with taxpayers via email or text message to request personal or financial information.

Hang up on impersonation calls—Impersonators often call you, posing as an IRS official, and insist on immediate payment or threaten legal action. Any demand for immediate payment over the phone is a red flag.

Use secure banking methods—Whether you owe taxes or receive a refund, ensure that you pay only on secure websites that begin with https://. Seeing a "lock" symbol before the URL means that a website is secure.

Many bank customers are reporting that scammers on social media asked them to send their paymend with Zelle or Wires. Zelle is intended for payments to recipients you know and trust and is not intended for the purchase of goods from retailers, online marketplaces or through social media posts.

Scammers are advertising using deceptive ads on social media with great deals on the hottest items like concert tickets. You pay, but it never arrives.

They are using shady listings on social feeds for bogus cleaning and home improvement services. You pay a deposit, no one shows.

They use fake profiles in groups showing great rental deals. You feel safe sending a deposit because it's posted by a group member, then they vanish.

Safety in Erie Village

A resident recently reported that they came home to find a postage stamp over their ring doorbell camera. This can prevent viewing the delivery of packages and anyone else coming to your door.

If you are going to be away for an extended period of time and are expecting packages to be delivered, considered asking a neighbor to pick it up for you and hold it until you get home.

Bird Feeders

People love having bird feeders outside their windows but now, they're being asked to remove them from their homes.

There are a lot of reasons why people love having bird feeders around their house. One big one is that when you have birds, you normally have fewer bugs. Their singing is the sound-track of spring, and just watching them makes a lot of people happy.

Cornell Cooperative Extension officials are asking area residents to take down their bird feeders to help stop cases of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza.

Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza is a serious, fatal disease of poultry. Since the beginning of the year, it's been identified in more than 350 wild birds in 20 states, including New York. New York has also had three cases of HPAI to date in backyard poultry flocks, which resulted in the death of 268 birds.

One way to protect domestic poultry stocks is to take down wild bird feeders for a little while.

While Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza is mostly carried by wild waterfowl, research has shown that other wild bird populations can carry it too, especially if they share nesting and feeding grounds with wild waterfowl. These populations include perching birds and songbirds.

"For this reason, we are recommending that folks that feed wild birds should take down their bird feeders until the threat of the disease has passed," Cornell Cooperative Extension officials wrote in a news release. "It is uncertain as to when it will be safe to put feeders back out, but scientists believe that case loads should decrease over the summer months. The highest risk of spreading the disease is now, during the spring migration. That said, this is a disease of the colder months, and we may see cases spike again during the fall migration."

Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza can cause unusual deaths and illness in both wild and domestic birds. Concerns about dead or sick wild birds can be directed to the State Department of Environmental Conservation. Unusual whole-flock illnesses or deaths in poultry can be directed to the state Department of Agriculture & Markets at 518-457-3502; the USDA (United States Department of Agriculture) at 866-536-7593; or a local Cornell Cooperative Extension Office.



Planning on Making Changes in 2025?

A reminder that any changes to the outside of your unit whether it's gutters, sidewalk, plantings outside the white fenced area or in some cases within the white fence, generators, high efficiency furnaces, gas fireplaces, EV charging stations, changes to your deck, etc., must be approved in advance of work commencing by the Architectural Committee(ACC). You can obtain a request form by calling the office at 315-656-5148 or by going to our website

Please supply as much information as possible such as contractor/installer name, drawings and if need be, written consent from surrounding neighbors.

The EVHOA requires that all contractors working in common areas be insured and that a Certificate of Insurance be obtained and submitted prior to work commencing when an ACC form is submitted.

On the bottom left corner of the Certificate, Accord 25 form, there is a block entitled Certificate Holder. In that block it MUST say:

Erie Village Homeowners Association

If that form is not properly completed, the request for Architectural Change will be denied and the Form will be returned delaying action to approve the request.

It's better to be safe than sorry. We have updated the ACC form and provided examples of items that need approval prior to commencement of work. You may think that a small change doesn't require a form but you should always ask first—again—before any work commences.




