As the warmer weather approaches, the ice on our lake and ponds is not safe. Please stay off the ice for your own safety.

Please remember that any suspicious activity should be reported to the Town of Manlius Police immediately. Waiting until the next day will not assist them in protecting the village.

Please Report Leaks Immediately

Ice backups have caused a few leaks in homes around the Village. Wynn and his staff of vendors have been kept busy making repairs and shoveling portions of roofs where leaks could occur. Once again, we have attempted to stay ahead of things by shoveling to prevent leaks. If you have a leak, please call the office immediately, so we can assess the situation before any additional damage occurs.

Garage Door Preventative Maintenance

Although the cold weather and the considerable snowfall make it difficult for all of us to get out and about, there are a few things you can do to prevent problems with your garage door operation. At least a couple times a year, you should check the lug nuts on the door panels to ensure they are tight. Keep the chain and tracks and especially the lower wheels lubricated with either WD40 or a silicone spray. Keep snow and ice clear from the bottom of the door to prevent freezing. The additional strain of the door being stuck to a patch of ice can cause your garage door opener to malfunction. This is especially important if you still have a wood door. Also, if your door panels are damaged, please contact the EVHOA for repair and/or replacement.

More Recycling Information

Soft cover books and #5 plastics are now accepted in your blue bin. #5's are wide-mouthed, tub shaped plastic containers that typically hold yogurt, margarine, cottage cheese, etc. Check the bottom for a #5 symbol to be sure.

You can be assured that the #5's that you place in your blue bin are actually being recycled into new products like other #5 containers, flower pots, buckets, thermal underwear, reusable grocery bags, etc.

As we approach spring I thought I'd try a new item for our newsletter—some recipes. Maybe something to test out for those "March Madness" and St. Patrick's Day parties.....

White Pizza Dip

- 1 envelope Lipton Recipe Secrets Savory Herb with Garlic Soup Mix (critical ingredient—no substitutions)
- 16 ounces sour cream
- 8 ounces ricotta cheese
- 1 cup mozzarella cheese, shredded
- 1 loaf Italian or French bread, sliced

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a shallow 1 quart casserole dish (or a glass ceramic pie dish), combine soup mix, sour cream, ricotta cheese and 3/4 cup mozzarella cheese. Bake uncovered for 30 minutes or until heated through. Serve with bread slices, as a dip or topping for the bread.

Salad Greens with Raspberries, Pears, Feta Cheese and Pecans

1 large package of salad greens 1 quart raspberries

2 medium pears, sliced in 8ths, then sliced again

1 quart feta cheese 2 cups roasted pecans

Dressing

1/3 cup raspberry balsamic vinaigrette 1/3 cup olive oil

2 tablespoons soy sauce 1 tablespoon parsley

1 teaspoon sugar 1 pinch of salt 1 pinch of pepper

Mix together the first 4 ingredients to make the salad. Mix together the last 7 ingredients to make the dressing. Roast pecans by baking at 325 degrees for 15-20 minutes.

Oven Porcupines

1 lb. ground beef

1/2 c. uncooked rice

1/2 c. water

1/2 c. onion chopped

1/2 c. green pepper diced

Salt & Pepper to taste

Celery Salt, to taste

Garlic Powder, to taste

1 (15 oz.) can Tomato Sauce

1 c. water

2 tsp. Worcestershire Sauce

Mix the 1st 8 ingredients in order given. Shape into balls and put into un-greased 8 x8 pan. Mix tomato sauce, water and Worcestershire sauce together and, pour over meat. Bake @ 350 degrees for 45 minutes covered and 15 minutes uncovered.

Snow Ball Cake

4 T. unflavored gelatin dash salt

2 c. boiling water2 c. orange juice2 lg. store-bought angel food cakes

2 tsp. lemon juice

1 c. sugar 1/2 c. coconut

Line a very large bowl with waxed paper. Mix the gelatin and boiling water until dissolved. Add the orange juice, salt and sugar. Mix and chill until syrupy. When gelatin is chilled, add 6 cups whipped topping (Cool Whip). Stir in lemon juice. Break angel food cake into bite-sized cubes. (You can buy cherry or lemon angel food cakes if you want variety). Fold the cake pieces into the gelatin and Cool Whip mixture. Pour into prepared bowl. Chill until firm (about 4 hours). Invert onto plate and frost with the remaining Cool Whip. Sprinkle with coconut. Serves 15 and can be made ahead of time






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
